

Headteacher's Message

I can't believe that we have come to the end of the first term already! What an amazing term it has been and it has been wonderful to feel like we are back to some sort of normality, with children playing together outside and out after school clubs starting up again. We would like to thank everybody for their full support and prompt actions regarding testing your children. It has definitely helped to keep us all safe and we have been lucky to have such few cases in school this term.

After two very turbulent years, we have focussed this term on high quality teaching and learning, getting the children into new routines and building new relationships. This has been very successful and we are so proud of what our children (and staff) have achieved. Next term we will begin to bring back our outdoor learning offer across the school, with our new outdoor learning space opening, and Forest school sessions for years R-4. We appreciate your patience regarding this delay, we know how important outdoor learning is to our school community and we are very excited that we can increase our offer again. Mrs Hulse and I are hoping to start up Forest School club after half term, initially for years 1 & 2 but we will switch it termly to give everyone a fair chance. We will let you know more information early next term.

We have been very busy behind the scenes developing our website. There is a lot more information on our curriculum pages and we are still adding content. One of the comments on the parent feedback forms was about being more aware of curriculum content each term, so we have been trying out a few ideas. When on our website, if you go to curriculum— class termly curriculum planners, you will see an example of our new planning format, which we intend to roll out in January. If you have any feedback on it, please come and see me, we want this to be a useful document for teachers and parents.

On our website, you can also find a copy of our school development plan. If there is something that you would like to see in school, have a look on the plan to see if it is coming up, if not, feel free to come and share your ideas with me. I am always happy to meet up and be take advice on board and work together.

Residentials—we have booked our year 5&6 residential trip! It is fantastic to be able to offer this again this year, it is such a memorable experience for children and staff alike. Mrs Tindall will be sending out a letter very soon and we will hold a meeting after half term. We are also intending on doing a shorter residential trip for years 3&4, and an evening event for years 1&2 in the summer term.

Times Table badges—we will be starting our times table challenges after half term where children will have the opportunity to earn bronze, silver and gold badges. Mrs Tindall is sending an information pack home over half term so that children can get practising! They were very excited when they got to see them today!

- * And much more I'm sure!




We want children to be involved too and so invite you to come along as a family and help the school. We will keep the tea, coffee and hot chocolate flowing, and maybe even have some cake!


