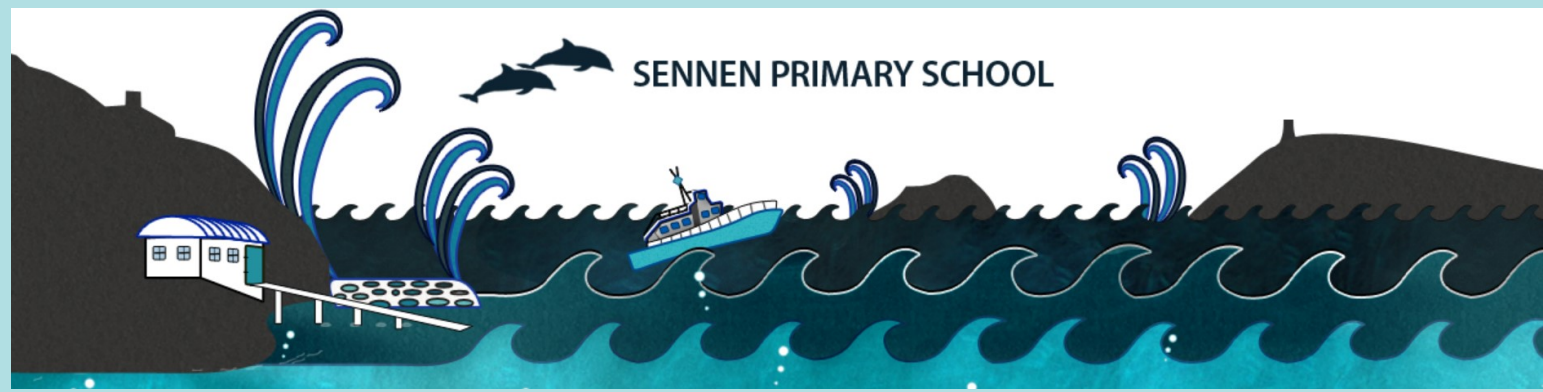
Longships— Louella for challenging herself and taking her learning forward when finding out about the different continents of the world. A fantastic attitude to your learning - just amazing!

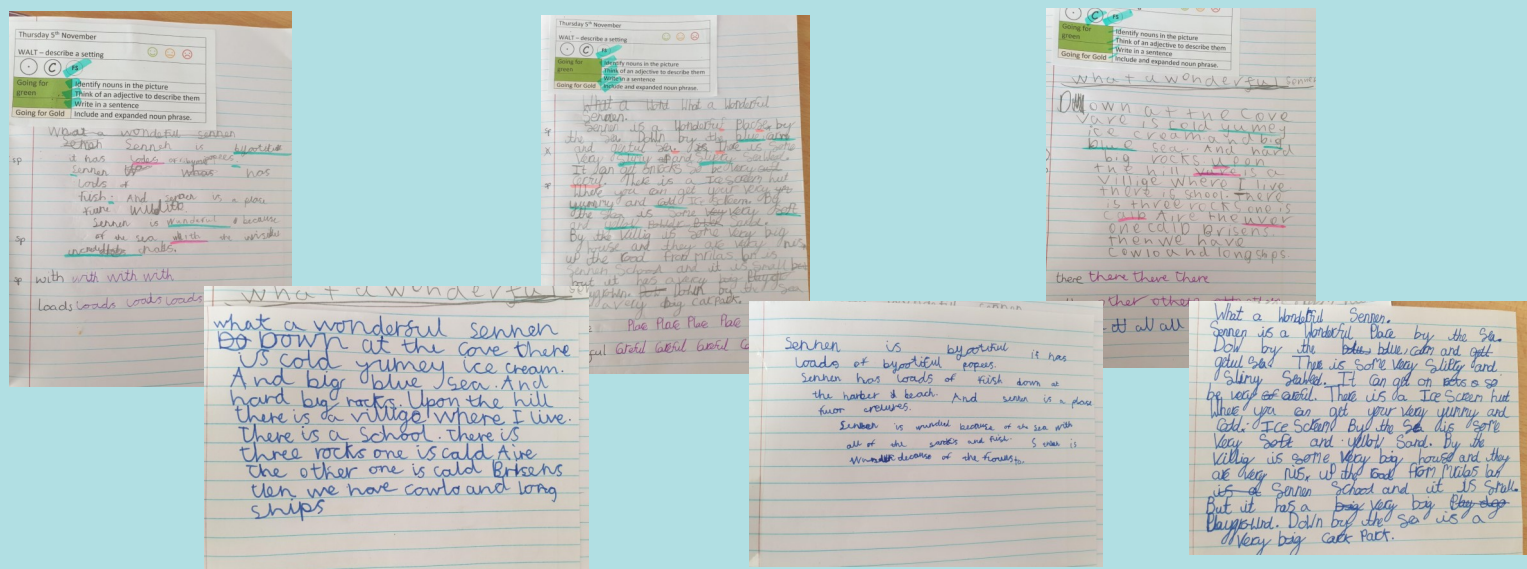


### Brisons class round up

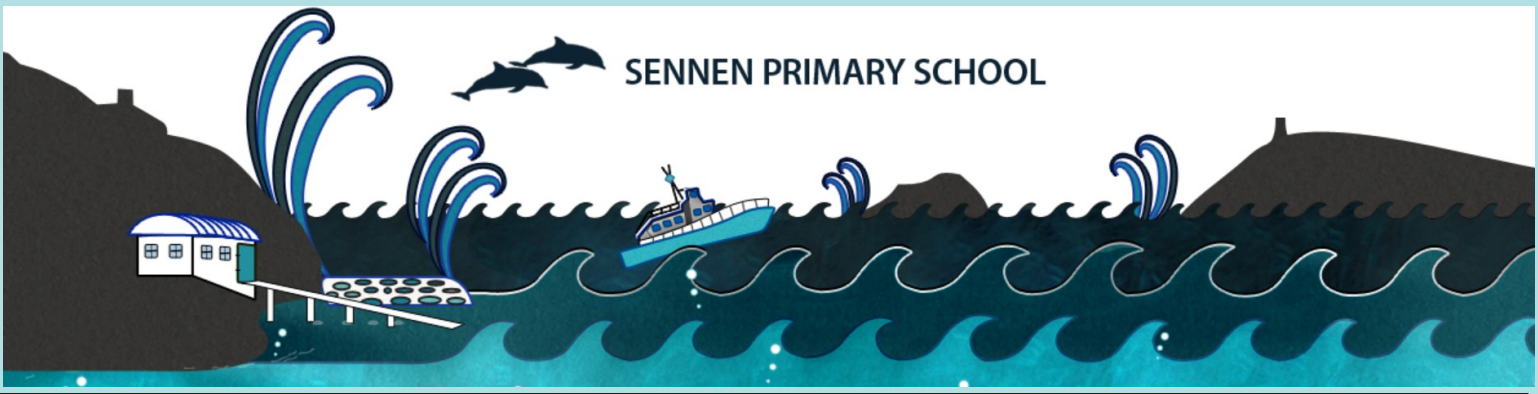

### Longships class round up

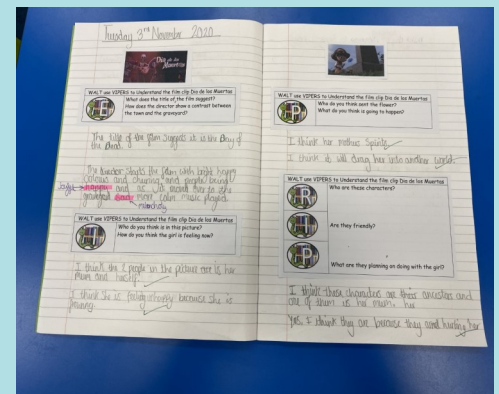
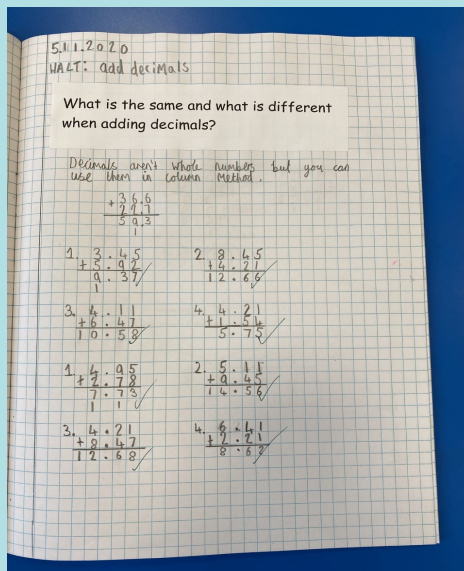
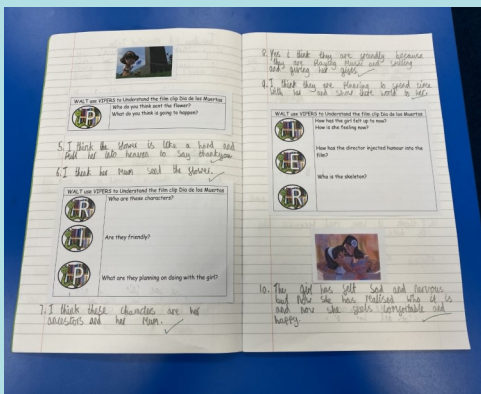
