

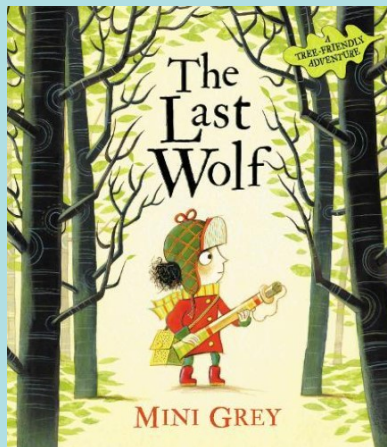
Headteacher update

This week has been so much fun in school, with lots of practical learning taking place. It was lovely to hear Longship’s laughing while doing their investigation on the human digestive system, and Cowloe had a great time setting up their investigations on micro-organisms.

Next week we have World Book day. As a school, we have chosen to look at the book called ‘The Last Wolf ‘ by Mini Grey. It is about the issues surrounding deforestation and the loss of habitats for our animals. Pupils are going to be doing some persuasive writing, revisiting their knowledge on plant growth in science, and having a go at germinating some seeds of their own. Along those lines, Longships are hoping to go over to Boacarne Farm to support them in their tree planting to try and encourage more habitats locally. We have suggested that they bring some wellies / waterproofs to put on in the afternoon.



Pupils have to opportunity to come in dressed up as a book character for the day, or some have asked to come in wearing PJs for the day. No donation needed—it’s just for fun!

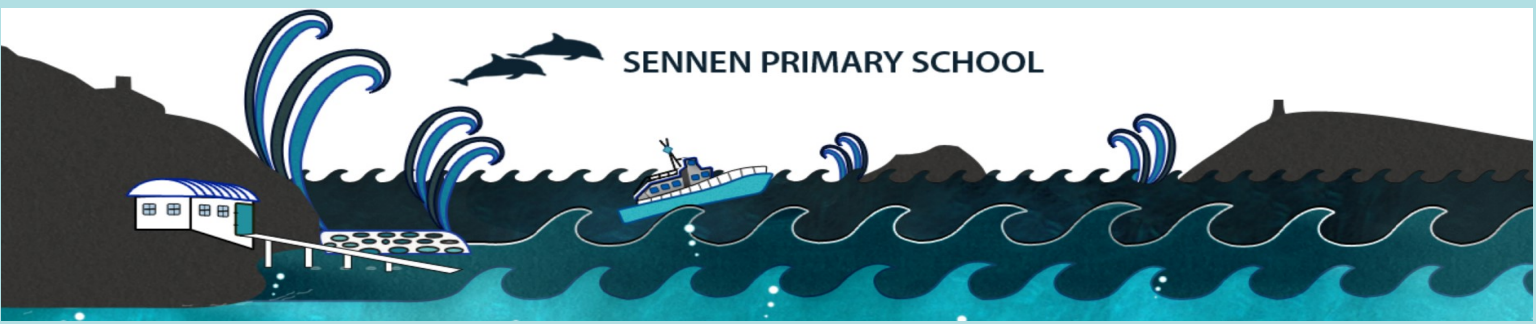

Aire class round up

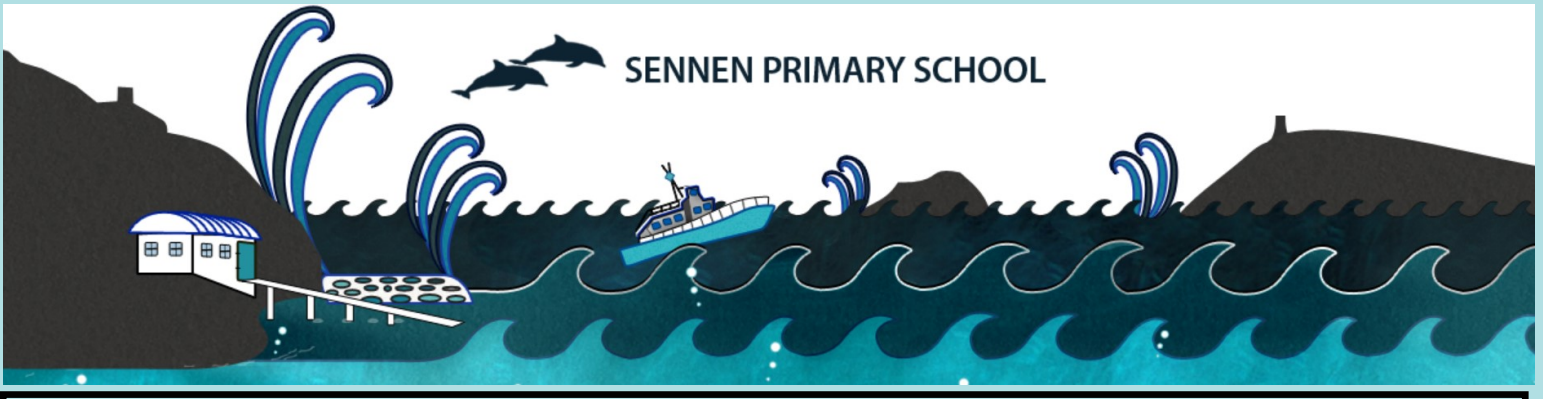

In English, we have started to look at the different features of an information text which will help us over the coming weeks to be able to write our own leaflets detailing how to keep our teeth healthy.

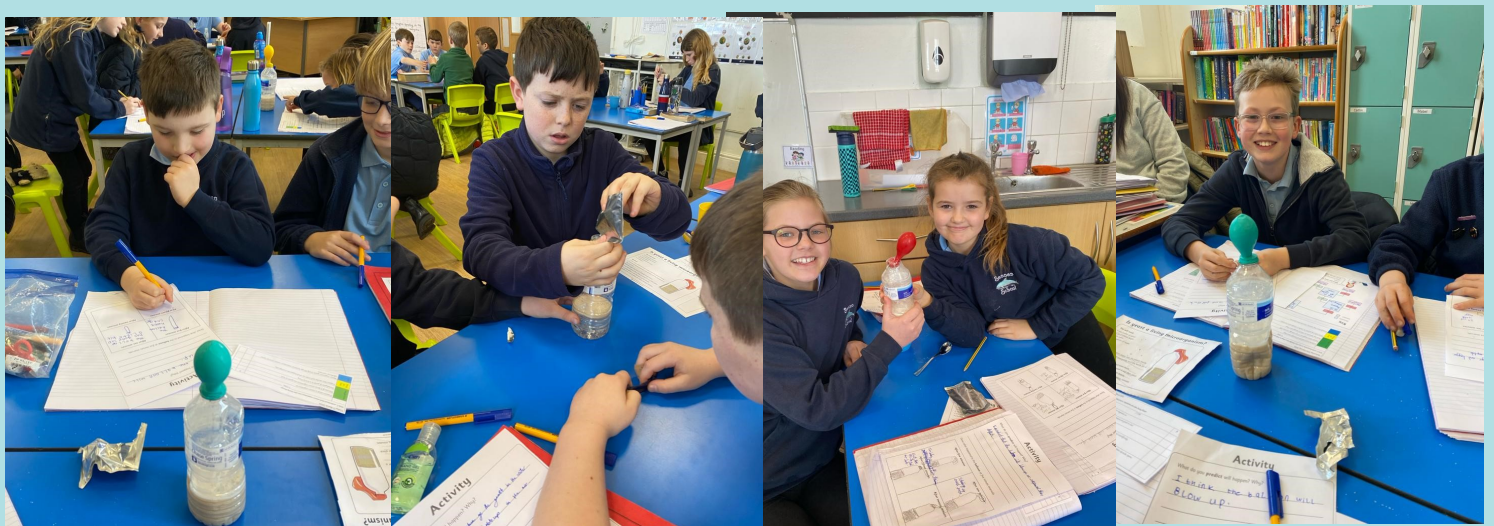
In maths, we have finally come to the end of multiplication and division methods and have begun to use a variety of units to measure length and rehearsed starting the ruler at zero.

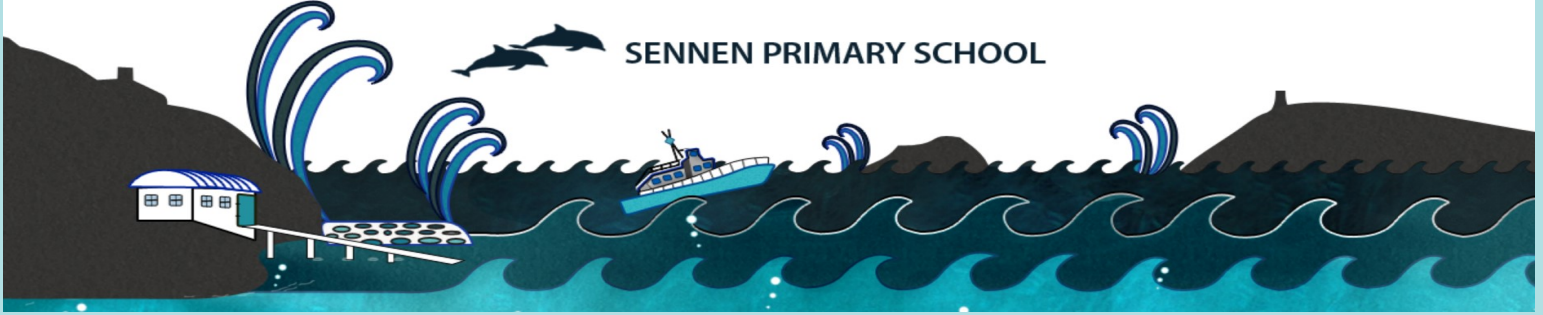

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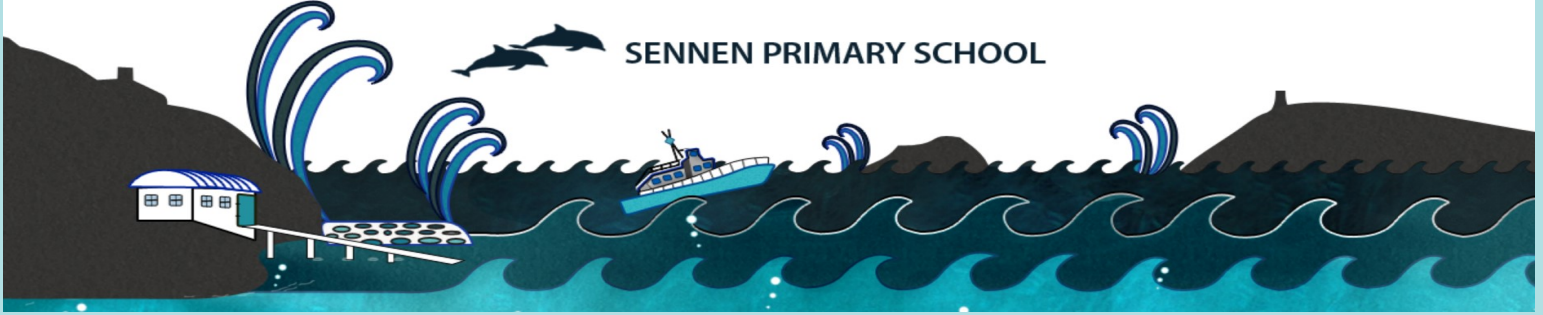
