



Headteacher's message

This week has seen some wonderful learning, teachers are particularly impressed with how the children have approached maths tasks ; they have shown resilience and reflection and have worked incredibly hard.

I have spent a lot of time walking around the school this week and have seen the children getting stuck into their topics. Aire class couldn't wait to tell me about the animal hunt that they were going on outside, Brisons and Longships have been sculpting clay pots and Cowloe have been carrying out some independent research about rainforests. All children are happy and engaged in their learning and are really enjoying being back with their friends.

This week years 2—6 started their PE sessions with our new PE teacher. They had a wonderful time and it was great to see them playing the same games together at playtime. These sessions will be every Wednesday and class teachers will take sessions on a Friday. Aire class have incorporated theirs into their continuous provision, they are always very active in there!

We are continuing to follow both national and trust guidance on this issue. Whilst it has brought many challenges, the positives are also great; children are enjoying their smaller playtimes more and behaviour has been exemplary. 
Important notices

Aire class round up



Longships class round up





In Maths we have been reading, writing and representing numbers up to ten million and I am so impressed with their understanding. The children have been considering how The Maya people adapted to living in a Rainforest environment and have been improving their research skills.


