

We have been learning about bees in Aire Class these past two weeks. We have read 'Bee and Me' learning lots of terrific new vocabulary which the children have done really well at using in their own speech. The children have enjoyed making bees out of pom-poms, learning about the bee lifecycle and designing and making a bee hotel for the garden.

In Maths, the children have been focusing on the concept of time and, this week, on the numbers 9 and 10.

Using the programme Scratch to manipulate a sprite has brought about some great teamwork and good discussions. Our skills are coming along nicely too,


