PE in term 4

We are very lucky next term to be hosting Chance to Shine Cricket, who are going to be doing 5 weeks of cricket for Brisons, Longships and Cowloe. **These sessions will be on a Monday**, so pupils can come to school in their PE kits. Other PE / outdoor education sessions for term 4 are:

Thursday—Swimming for Aire class, please bring swimming things in a bag

Friday—Forest School for Cowloe and Aire class. Please wear home clothes and bring warm / waterproof layers and wellies for the afternoon.

If for some reason your child is unable to take part in PE that day (for example dur to an injury or illness), we ask that you inform us directly and have explained the importance of this to the children.

Bringing toys into school

We have had a recent influx of pupils bringing toys in from home (such as Tech Decks, Rubix cubes etc), particularly amongst the older children. Whilst it can be lovely for them to have these things, they have been causing significant challenges when things bet lost / broken / misused. It has been taking up a lot of staff's time to sort these challenges out, as well as causing a lot of upset between the children. We have asked that all toys be kept at home (unless there is a prior arrangement with the class teacher). We have told the

children that if any come into school we will remove them for safe keeping and hand back to parents at the end of the day. We really appreciate your support in this matter.

From the School Governors

On behalf of the school community, the governors extend their thanks to Linda Barnicoat for her service as our vice chair, who has recently resigned from her position. Over a span of more than ten years, Linda has dedicated considerable time and effort towards the successful running of the school, greatly benefiting us. In our upcoming meeting in March, we will aim to elect a new vice chair.

The governors are committed to keeping parents informed on a half-termly basis through a section in this newsletter. This update will cover the activities and focus areas of the governors. Additionally, we provide a brief overview of the role of school governors below.

Understanding School Governance

In Sennen, our local governing board (LGB) operates under the umbrella of the Truro and Penwith Academy Trust (TPAT) Board of Trustees. The trustees, who hold the ultimate responsibility for all schools in the trust, delegate specific powers and responsibilities to the LGB, detailed in the 'Scheme of Delegated Authority' available on the TPAT website.

Our LGB consists of eleven members, including the headteacher, a staff governor, elected parent governors, and co-opted governors who offer particular skills or expertise. Governors usually serve for four years, with the possibility of serving multiple terms. The board is led by a chairperson, with a vice chair acting as deputy. These positions are elected annually by the governors. The clerk, who attends meetings as well, is tasked with minute-taking and assisting the chair with procedural matters. Minutes are publicly accessible upon request. Except for staff members and the clerk, all governors are volunteers.

The LGB convenes fully six times a year, approximately once every half term. Additionally, there's a leadership team, including the headteacher, chair, vice chair, and two senior governors, meeting monthly to discuss school leadership.

The TPAT Trustees and the LGB are tasked with ensuring the school's clear vision, ethos and strategic direction, holding leaders accountable for educational outcomes and staff performance, overseeing financial stewardship, and ensuring stakeholder engagement.

Governors are available for contact via email, and those who are parents can often be found in the playground during school drop-off/pick -up times.

Spring Half Term 1 Update

During a late January meeting, the LBG addressed several key points:

The headteacher presented an update on the teaching of reading and writing, utilising the Read Write Inc phonics-based approach.

A comprehensive report from the headteacher covered various operational aspects of the school, offering governors the chance to inquire about external monitoring, attendance, premises, staffing, curriculum, safeguarding, behaviour, and safety.

Discussions on compliance with safeguarding measures and related issues were undertaken.

The review of updates from the trust, with the chair participating in tri-annual meetings with TPAT representatives to exchange best practices.

Self-assessment by the governors on their effectiveness, potential skill gaps, training needs, and monitoring within the school.

This term's focus will include monitoring visits on safeguarding, special educational needs and pupil premium curriculum adaptations, quality of education with a focus on mathematics, and early years' personal, social, and emotional development.


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Forest School
