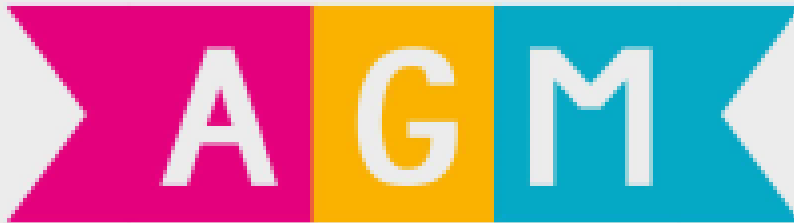




A message from FOSS

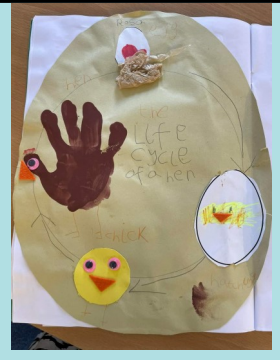
Aire class round up

It's been a lovely few weeks in Aire Class! We have read "Snail Trail" and the children enjoyed recreating Matisse's piece "The Snail". They also learnt about snail habitats, anatomy and how to make a snailery. We also read the lovely book "Swirl By Swirl" which is about spirals occurring in nature. This inspired the children to create animals in clay with spiral elements (coiled snakes, snails, monkeys with curly tails and elephants with spiralling trunks). In Maths, the children have really got to grips with subtraction and have been using some excellent maths talk to explain their Maths thinking.

This week was very exciting (!!) because we saw our eggs hatch! The children have loved watching the hatchlings grow. The chicks are now in Downran and will enjoy the free range life once they are old enough.

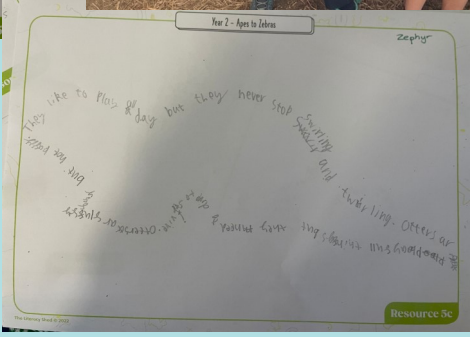
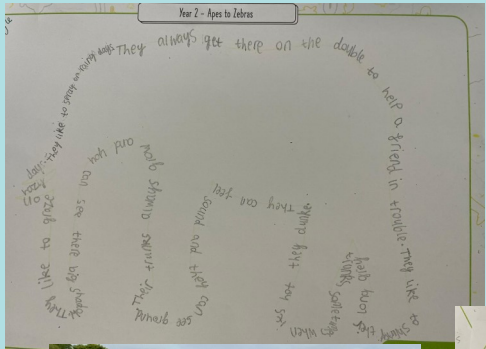
The children have loved water play in this warm weather and have enjoyed exploring what can be done with water beads - so much creativity here!

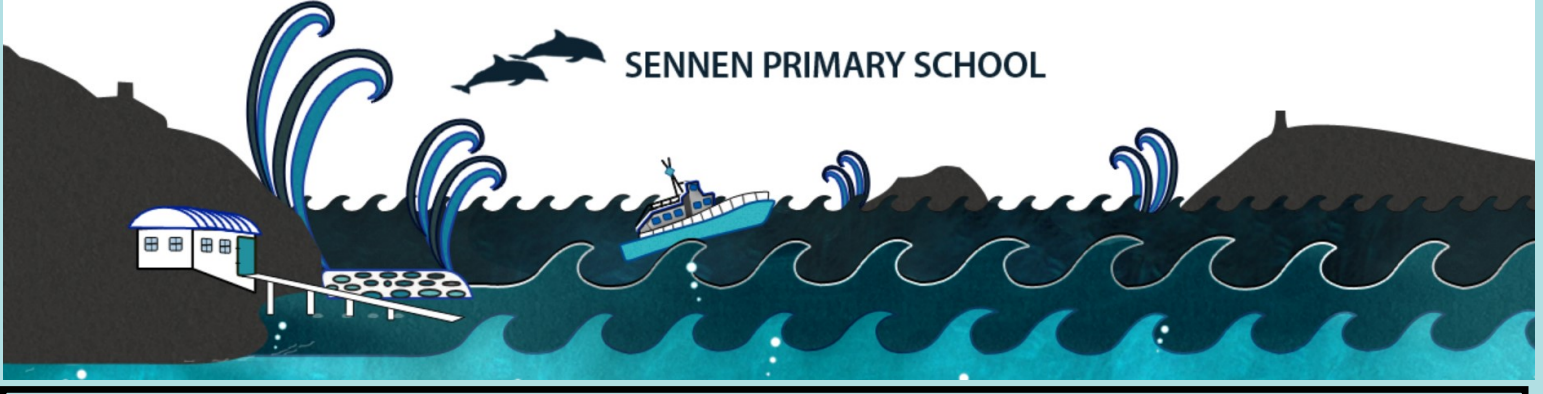

We spotted key features in the landscape, made beach shelters for toys and have explored the power of the sun by lighting a fire with a Fresnel Lens. This led us to explore sun safety - practising our sun safety skills with our beach toys.

Longships class round up

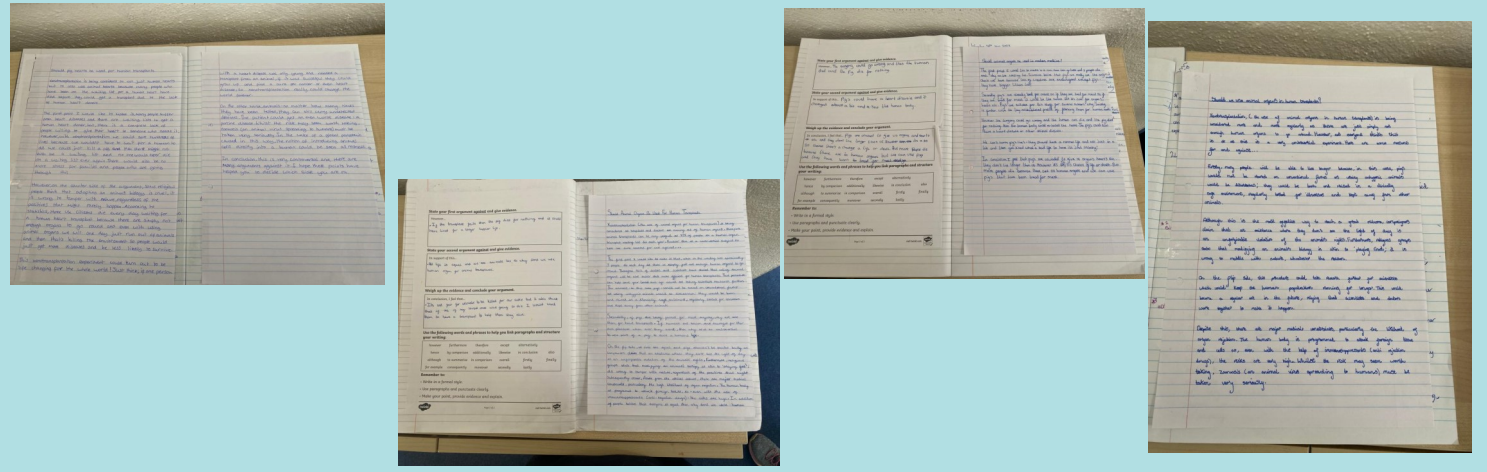
In Longships, we have finished writing out explanation texts about the lifecycle of flowering plants. The children have blown me away with their retention of the process as well as their ability to use technical vocabulary and formal language. In maths, Year 3 have been looking at the relationship between millilitres and litres including adding and subtracting using those units. Meanwhile, Year 4 have been investigating the place value of tenths and hundredths using a place value chart. Longships have also worked so hard on their reading at home, so we have enjoyed one or two treats too! Well done for your incredible efforts (adults too)- keep it up!

There has also been some planting going on which we hope to continue into next half term. We have begun to sell some of our plants this week, but hope to hold more plant sales into next half term too. If you have any extra plants, pots or compost that you are happy to donate, we would be incredibly grateful to receive these for school funds & the children's enjoyment. Thank you.
