

We have seen such a lot of brilliant progress in many areas (especially in writing, maths and social skills) these last two weeks as the children have engaged with our Fairytales topic. Last week, we focused on 'Little Red Riding Hood', exploring alternative versions to the traditional tale. The children created their own book covers featuring their own titles, characters and settings. In Forest School, we had a visit from Red Riding Hood herself who had lost the key to Grandma's house. Thankfully the woodcutter had drawn a map of the key's location in Christopher's garden and the children enjoyed using this to find it! This week, we have been reading 'The Magic Paintbrush' (a traditional tale from China) and learning about all things Chinese given that this week marks the start of it. The children have made dragon props for their dragon dance, lanterns and have experimented with using chopsticks to eat fried rice. In Maths, we have been learning how to combine two groups to find a total. We have loved seeing lots of independent writing in the children's play sessions. Well done guys!

The children have worked really hard in Brison's this week, we have carried out science investigations to find out if we can twist, bend, squash and stretch different materials. The children were in charge of setting up the investigation and making it fair, and also were given the responsibility of creating charts to record on. We have continued to learn lots about The Great Fire of London and have been writing great diary entries pretending that we were there with Samuel Pepys.

This week we have spoken about how we would like to raise money for our zoo trip and the children have decided on a bake sale. We will be making some things to sell in the afternoon. This will be on Friday 3rd February and any baked donations will be greatly received, it will take place after school.






Longships class round up


This week we have finished making the chassis for our slingshot cars and had loads of fun testing them out. We are very much looking forward to adding the bodywork to them next week.

In maths, we have perfected our written strategies to multiply a 2-digit number by a single digit before moving on to dividing. In English, we have planned and begun to write stories based on the animation 'Ride of Passage' about an exciting animal-based adventure into the jungle. It has been lovely to see the ambitious vocabulary that we have started to use across the class.

The children have been writing so much this week and I am so impressed with their resilience. In English we have been writing our flashback narrative, using lots of emotive vocabulary and clauses to add more detail. They have really embraced this unit with enthusiasm and I can't wait to read their final drafts. In topic, we have written letters from the point of view of an evacuee which have shown their fantastic knowledge and their ability to empathise with the children at the time. In Maths, we have been working hard on fractions- finding common denominators to add and subtract fractions including mixed numbers. The learning has been amazing and I look forward to sharing our final work soon.






Curriculum focus

Over the last year, we have worked very hard on our curriculum to ensure that pupils see that there are many different ways to excel. I want to raise awareness of the work going on in school by highlighting a different subject in each newsletter. This week the focus is computing.

At our school we want pupils to be Masters of Technology and not slaves to it. Technology is everywhere and will play a pivotal part in students' lives. Therefore, we want to model and educate our pupils on how to use technology positively, responsibly and safely. We want our pupils to be creators not consumers and our broad curriculum encompassing Computer Science (programming and understanding howdigital systems work), Information Technology (using computer systems to store, retrieve and sendinformation) and Digital Literacy (evaluating digital content and using technology safely and respectfully) reflects this. We want our pupils to understand that there is always a choice with using technology and as a school we utilize technology (especially social media) to model positive use.

At Sennen School we follow the National Curriculum 2014 for Computing. We aim to provide high-quality computing education which equips children to use computational thinking and creativity to prepare them for the future world they will be living in. We believe that computing is an essential part of the curriculum; a subject which not only stands alone but also forms an integral part of our curriculum. We use 2 main programs to help us deliver our curriculum: Teach computing (for digital science and Information Technology) and Natterhub (for Digital literacy).
