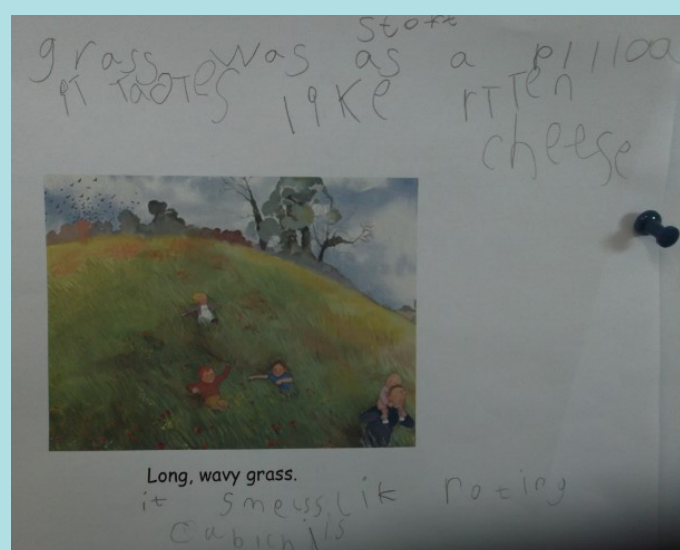
- ⇒ The play equipment is closed Mon—Fri, including straight after school. It will be left open after school on Fridays and closed again on Monday morning.

Aire class round up

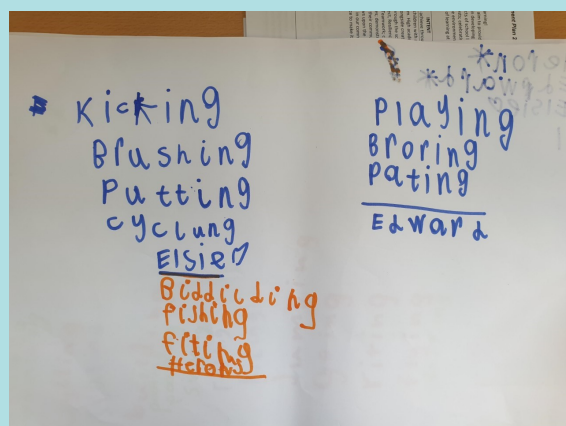

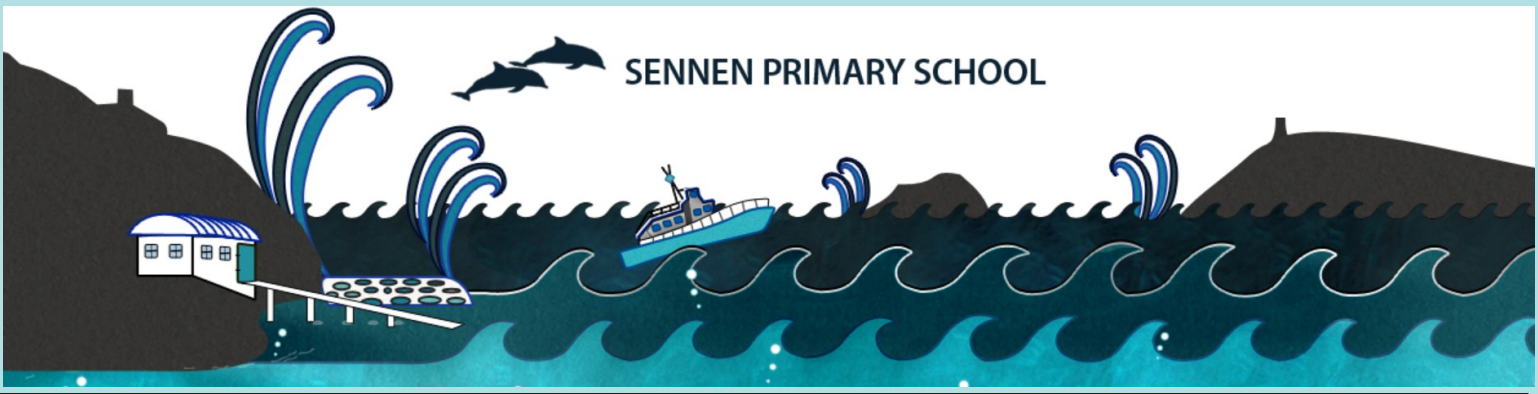


Brisons class round up

In topic the children have great fun with papier mâché and are still really enjoying their stone age role play outside.

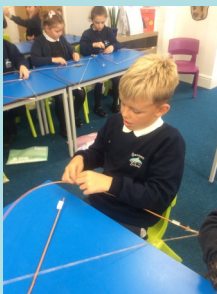




Longships class round up

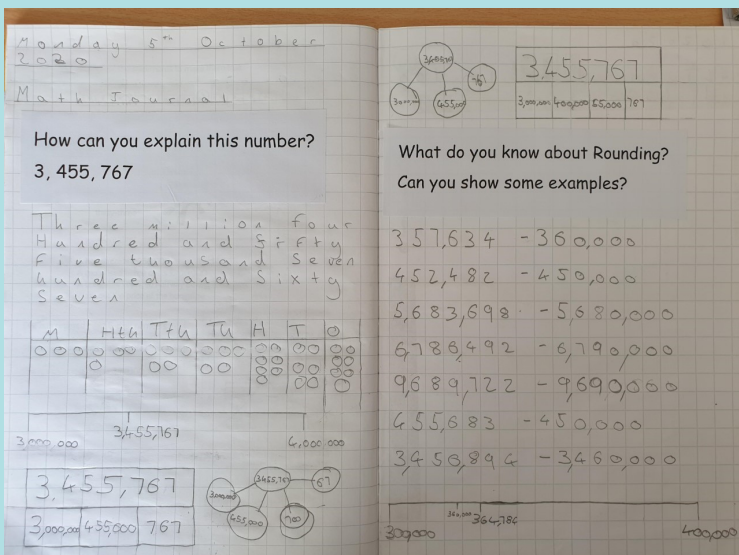

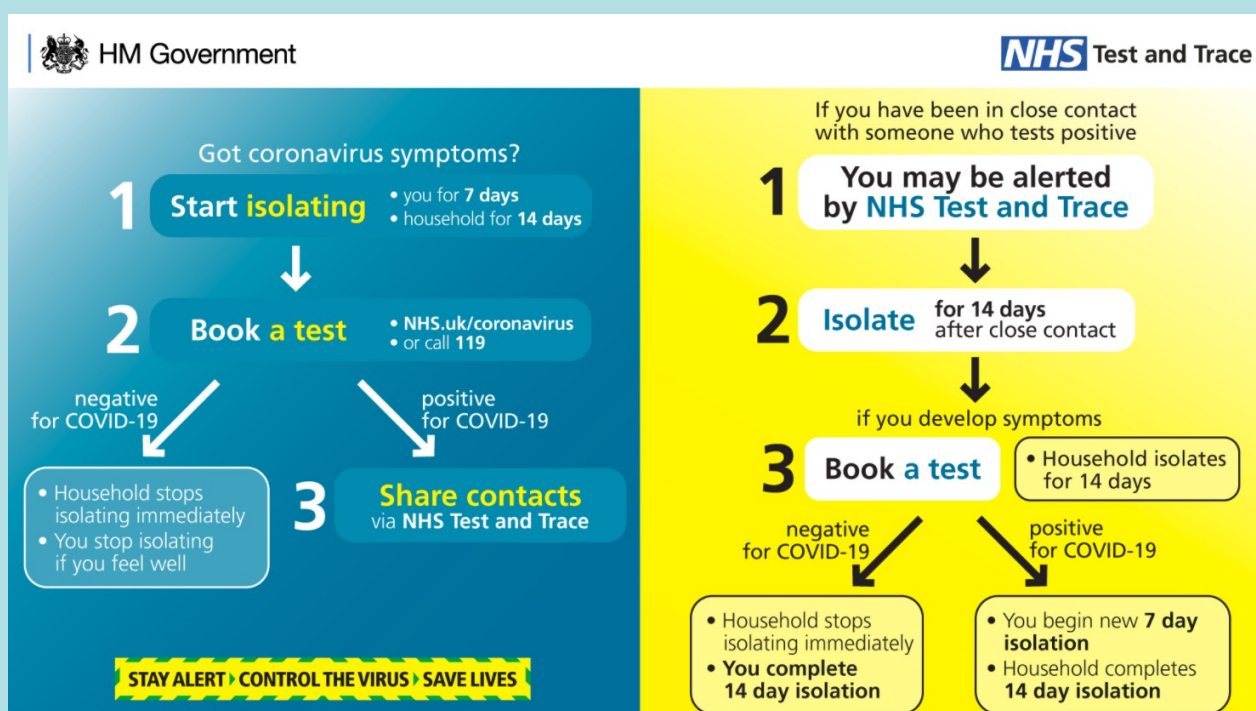
