Have a great weekend—I'm sure I will see some of you around at various bonfire night events!




### Aire class round up

We had a brilliant return to school in Aire Class with the start of our new theme "Let's Celebrate!" This week we have concentrated on the stories "Gustavo the Shy Ghost" and "Pumpkin Soup" both of which focus on friendship. We have looked at the artwork of Yayoi Kasuma and have attempted to replicate it by decorating pumpkins with dots. The children have made bats, willow wands and pumpkin soup. They have excelled in phonics, reading with increased speed and some beginning to write words. In Maths, we have focused on the composition of 4 and 5. # Brisons class round up

Brisons have worked so hard this week, even with all the different things going on like Halloween and Storm Ciaran. In our D.T lessons we have been looking about what s a fruit and what is not.
