This week, our focus has been on seals. Our focus story has been 'Finn, the Little Seal'. We also visited the Jackson Foundation to see Kurt Jackson's latest exhibition 'The Cornish Seal'. The children learnt a lot about seals, protecting the ocean, how an artist might work and painting with watercolours.

In Literacy, the children have learnt about character and setting, fiction and non-fiction.

In Maths, we have learnt more about 3D shapes and about repeating patterns.

In Forest school, we have made 3D shapes and patterns using natural materials. We have also looked at the work of Andy Goldsworthy.

In free play, digging with diggers and being Guinea pigs have been popular activities!


We followed this up by analysing our finds and spotting patterns to decide how we could reduce plastic usage.

Cowloe have embraced this terms topic, Ancient Greece, with huge enthusiasm and have begun learning about who the Ancient Greeks were, where they lived and what life was like in Athens and Sparta. At break times they have even been playing 'Trojan war'. We will be applying our learning of Greek myths in our new DT topic by creating a pop-up book showing their favourite myth. In English, we have been writing a set of instructions on how to slay Medusa and in maths we have been learning how to calculate the perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes, triangles and circles. This half term, Year 6 will be taking their SATS and I am really proud of how hard they have been working. I will send out more detailed information about SATS week next week.
