

Headteacher's message

What a wonderful week it has been! It has been so lovely seeing all the children back together, they have loved catching up with their friends and have got straight on with their learning—the atmosphere across the whole school has been fantastic.

We have spent the week getting back into routine and resetting expectations. Teachers have been beginning to look at priorities for their class and have set to work on making sure the children are equipped in all the right areas, whether it be personal and social, physical or academic.

We are very lucky to have secured some money for new CCTV and fencing this term. This means that we are able to start developing our outside area. We have tree to plant and some landscaping to do, so we will be asking for parental support to help us with our 'big dig'. It would be great for the children to play a part in creating the school's future.

Exciting news—Mrs Hulse has been bringing her lovely dog Olive into school with her during lockdown, and will be continuing to do so on her days in school. Studies show that encouraging children to take an interest in animals can have a positive effect on them and can be used to improve human and animal welfare. Some of the benefits have been identified are:

School animals have been found to:

- motivate pupils to think and to learn, as children have a high level of natural interest, enthusiasm and enjoyment of animals
- encourage a respect and reverence for life in pupils and thereby improve their relationships with other pupils, parents and teachers
- foster a sense of responsibility in children
- teach children to nurture and respect life
- lead to the development of hobbies /careers in animal care
- improve academic achievement

Animals in schools also have social benefits for the school community:

- enhance the learning environment, creating a sense of security and family warmth for the pupils
- encourage the involvement of parents and the wider community in school activity
- help to promote the school as an important nurturing influence in the community

When Olive is in school, Mrs Hulse will put a sign on Aire class door so that you know she is in school that day. The policy and risk assessment can be found on our website.

This week has been a wonderful week, the energy and enthusiasm that children provide is like no other and we hope that is stays that way for a very long time. As I said in my guidance for returning to school, we aim to keep our school open as long as possible. I would ask that our community continue to stick to the national guidance in order to support this—let's hope we are at the end of a very long road.

SHHH! Keep these quiet until Monday!


<u>Aire</u>— Freddie for his super effort with his writing this week and his Supertato story telling!

- ⇒ We are keeping the windows open to allow fresh air to flow through, so please make sure you child has a jumper or fleece (or both) in school.




Aire class round up



Managing illness

Symptom	Action
Temperature New, continuous cough (NHS describes this as having at least 3 'coughing fits' in 24 hrs) Loss of taste or smell	 Do not come to school, contact school to notify Follow Covid 'Stay at home guidance' Contact NHS 111 or visit NHS 111 online and arrange a Covid test If negative, return to school once well enough If positive, continue follow 'Stay at home guidance'
Vomiting and / or diarrhoea	 Do not come to school, contact school to notify Contact NHS 111 or visit NHS 111 online for advice If a Covid test is not needed, children must be 48hrs clear of symptoms to return to school (as was previously)
Sore throat Headache Fatigue Runny Nose	 If well enough in themselves, children are able to attend. If 2 or more symptoms are present, or if you are feeling concerned, please ring 111 or visit NHS 111 online for advice before sending to school.
